Except by specific prior written permission, Coastal Zone Canada 2014 does not permit the recording of presentations at the conference under any circumstances or in any form or media, including but not limited to audio recordings, still photography, video recordings, or literal transcripts.



CZC 2014 permits and encourages the use of social media, such as Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn and Lanyrd at the conference as a way to summarize, highlight, excerpt, review, critique, and/or promote the presented materials, or the conference in general, provided that:
